

LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT - AI Rae

I hope you all had a good Thanksgiving holiday. The weather here at the beach could have been better without the high wind and rain. The beach took a pounding with waves up to the dunes causing a lot of damage. (See attached picture later in this newsletter.) The much needed beach replenishment funding is still not final and your support is still needed. I agree that it seems like this funding process has been going on forever but we are still not done. Here is an update:

- > When it began the project was described as a 50-year (will last) beach replenishment project overseen by the U.S. Army Corp of Engineers.
- > The whole project was estimated to cost \$25.5 million, with \$14.5 million needed from the federal government.
- Late 2005 the U.S. Congress allocated \$3 million for the project the State of Delaware will match these funds. This would leave \$11.5 Million still needed from Congress.
- Bethany and South Bethany needed 67 oceanfront property owners to approve easements in front of their property for the project to proceed. All but three were received and these three have been turned over to the State for condemnation processing.
- This year Congress has still not voted on our needed funding in the 2007 budget because of the changes in control of Congress. The South Bethany Lobbyist Marlowe & Company provided a briefing on the project on December 4th and said that it may be February 2007 before funding is approved. That Congress may approve only another \$3 million. That would leave an additional \$8 million to be approved in the future before the project could begin.
- > The project can not begin until it is fully funded.

Because of the continued need for funding, I would like to ask that you once again contact your members of Congress (House and Senate) and ask them to approve the needed funds for our beach replenishment. We still need some additional funds and we need your help by going to the e-mail site (listed below) maintained by the Town's consultant Marlow & Co., enter your information including zip code and then they will create e-mails in your name to the correct Congressman and Senators. WINTER 2006

A new issue which has been reported in the local newspapers, that some SBPOA members have contacted us about, is the receipt of a notice from their property insurance company stating that their coverage will not be renewed. Delaware Insurance Commissioner Matt Denn recently said that "One of our major companies, which already declines to insure homes within 1,000 feet of the coast, is expanding that zone to 2,500 feet. Another major insurer is placing a cap on the amount of new coastal homeowners insurance its agents can sell each month. A third one plans to stop new sales of homeowners insurance to homes within two miles of the coast," We advise that all SBPOA members need to insure that their insurance coverage is continued and should you lose your coverage to immediately:

- > Ask your insurance agent to shop around and arrange for new coverage.
- Coastal homeowners who lose their coverage and need to discuss options should call the Delaware Insurance Commissioner's consumer hotline at 1-800-282-8611.
- Insurance Commissioner Denn said that coastal homeowners seeking new policies may end up purchasing a policy in the Delaware FAIR plan, which is operated jointly by insurance companies as a "last-resort" source of homeowners insurance. Also please let the Town of South Bethany and the South Bethany Property Owners Association know of any changes or additions to the above information.

At the last SBPOA Membership meeting on August 30th, property owners noted that Verizon was beginning to offer cable TV services in Delaware and suggested that SBPOA write a letter to Verizon encouraging them to offer competing services in South Bethany. The motion passed unanimously. Since the meeting, I first talked to Town Hall and determined that Verizon TV services would be allowed in addition to the current Mediacom services. I then contacted the President of Verizon, Mr. Bill Allan, and on 11-6-06 received a response which I am including because of how much interest there has been on this subject. His response is: "...the Delaware Public Service Commission voted unanimously to grant Verizon a video franchise. This franchise covers those parts of unincorporated Delaware where Verizon has announced plans to build its Fiber to the Premises network. It initially includes Angola (Sussex), Hockessin, Talleyville, Wrangle Hill, Holly Oak and the unincorporated areas around Middletown, Newark and Dover. Unfortunately, the Town of South Bethany is not on our deployment schedule for 2007. Verizon's engineering department is aware of your community's interest. We will keep you posted as our deployment progresses over the next few years."

Another issue of concern discussed at the last Membership meeting on August 30^{th,} is the ongoing problem of foot traffic crossing Route # 1 during the summer season. It is often dangerous and beachgoers are forced to wait a long time for traffic to stop and allow a crossing opportunity. I met with both the South Bethany Police Chief and Town Manager

regarding this issue and was encouraged to learn of two new developments: first, that this winter all 13 of the South Bethany crosswalks will be re-done by DelDOT to be brought into compliance with the American Disabilities ACT (ADA). That this project will level the crosswalks eliminating the puddles that form in the middle; that the new crosswalks will be 6 -8 feet wide and will be re-painted and therefore will be more noticeable by cars; that all of the coastal highway through South Bethany will be re-paved next spring. The other development is that the Town is accepting an offer received from the University of Delaware regarding the "Safety Circuit Rider Program". The UD offer is to perform a free pedestrian and traffic study of South Bethany. This study, staffed by experts knowledgeable in what has worked for other coastal communities would result in valuable recommendations. UD does not fund the changes recommended. We are continuing to follow this subject.

Finally, congratulations to Scott Moore for being selected the lifeguard of the year for 2006. He received \$200 from the SBPOA, and his name has been added to the plaque, in memory of Ian Saylor, which is displayed in the Town Hall.

911 Locator Alert System:

One of our members asked that we make you aware of the following. The fire company is passing out information on a 911 Locator Alert System being offered by a private company for a fee. The system is a high intensity flashing strobe light that is attached to the top of your mail box or a separate post in front of your house. Should you call 911 or activate a medic-alert, the strobe starts blinking to assist the ambulance or police in finding your house. SOUTH COASTAL LIBRARY BUILDING CAMPAIGN UPDATE:

The Friends of the South Coastal Library (FOSCL) have begun the Capital Campaign to raise the necessary funds to expand and improve the library facility, located at 43 Kent Avenue in Bethany Beach. Since the present library was built in 1994 the number of patron visits to the library has increased dramatically. The number of patron visits increased from 95,005 in 2001 to 123,094 in 2005. State Senator George Bunting and State Representative Gerald Hocker have agreed to serve as honorary co-chairmen of the Campaign.

The objectives (not finally agreed to by the County) of the new South Coastal Library / Cultural Center building expansion project are to:

- Increase library / meeting space from the current 10,000 sq. feet to more than 20,000 sq. feet.
- > Enhance educational and cultural opportunities at the Library / Cultural Center by providing added space including a 150 person meeting room with a stage and kitchen.
- Provide added space to be used by the surrounding communities, such as South Bethany, for workshops, training, club meetings and more.

With a campaign goal of \$3 $\frac{1}{2}$ million dollars (which is $\frac{1}{2}$ the total project cost) donations from property owners, businesses, visitors, governments and friends in the surrounding communities are being requested to help achieve the building of this important community asset.

Material will be pumped via pipeline to a second upland disposal facility located on property owned by the Division of Fish and Wildlife."

Page 8 of 8 **Update on Windmills**

Recently the Delaware General Assembly passed House Bill 6, (now incorporated as DE Code Title 26, Chapter 10, § 1007 (d) (3)) { http://www.delcode.state.de.us/title26/c010/index.htm#TopOfPage } which requires among other things "Resources that provide short- or long-term environmental benefits to the citizens of this State (such as renewable resources like wind and solar power)" In reply to this new law Delmarva Power issued a Request for Proposal on November 1 for construction of new, cost effective resources for Delaware. Bluewater Wind will be one of the responders. They will probably be proposing a windfarm of about 200 windmill turbine to be located no closer than 7 miles off shore. At this distance a turbine would appear on the horizon to be about ¾ of an inch tall and as thin as a tooth pick.
